Anything Interesting or Different than EPA MSGP?

Two different stormwater permits.

- **COR900000:** stormwater discharges associated with non-extractive industrial activity for specific industries
- **COG500000:** process water and stormwater for sand and gravel mining and processing operations

Plan Required to Be Submitted to the Agency?

No, only upon request

Visual Monitoring Required?

Yes, quarterly

Any other Monitoring Applicable to all Sources (not sector specific monitoring):

At least one annual quarterly inspection during a runoff event

Minimum Inspection Frequency:

Quarterly

Annual Report / Due Date:

March 31 st	COR900000
February 28 th	COG500000)

Training Frequency:

Annual
