NOI Required to Continue Coverage:

Yes, due by 30-May-21. Coverage terminated if NOI is not submitted by deadline.

Fee Required / Fee Amount:

No fee

Any Expected Changes with Permit Renewal:

- New public notice sign posting requirement.
- Consideration of stormwater control enhancements for major storm events.
- Quarterly indicator monitoring for pH, TSS, and COD (certain sectors).
- Bi-annual indicator monitoring for PAHs (coal-tar sealcoat)

Anything Interesting or Different than EPA MSGP?

N/A - EPA is the stormwater authority for this state.

Plan Required to Be Submitted to the Agency?

The SWPPP must be made publicly available by either attaching it to the NOI, including a URL location in the NOI, or by summarizing specific information from the SWPPP in the NOI.

Visual Monitoring Required?

Yes, quarterly.

Any other Monitoring Applicable to all Sources (not sector specific monitoring):

Effluent limitations guidelines monitoring, impaired waters monitoring, PAH indicator monitoring for discharges from paved surfaces that will be sealed or re-sealed with coal-tar sealcoat

Minimum Inspection Frequency:

Quarterly

Annual Report / Due Date:

January 30th

Training Frequency:

Not specified. EPA recommends annual or upon hire.

No
