

OREGON STORMWATER PERMIT QUICK FAQs

Stormwater General Permit Issuance Date:
7/1/2021

Expiration Date:
6/30/2026

NOI Required to Continue Coverage:

Apply for renewal 180 days prior to expiration

Fee Required / Fee Amount:

Application fees and annual fees are required. Fee amount varies depending on the type of activities covered

Any Expected Changes with Permit Renewal:

New permit will become effective on July 1, 2021. A summary of changes coming to the new permit is include the following:

- Eligibility criteria for new facilities discharging into impaired waterbodies narrowed to certain parameters only;
- Mass reduction measures from previous permit cycles require recertification by PE;
- New corrective actions rules for impaired waterbody monitoring;
- BOD5 benchmark lowered for one area in the state; and,
- New visual inspection requirements.

Anything Interesting or Different than EPA MSGP?

- Limited Monitoring to Category 5:303(d) list impairments for one or more of the following: copper, lead, zinc, pH, iron, E. coli, fecal coliform and enterococcus
- Stormwater Pollution Control Plan (SWPCP) rather than a SWPPP
- Monthly visual inspections

Plan Required to Be Submitted to the Agency?

SWPCP submittal is only required upon request. For existing facilities seeking continuing coverage with the new permit, an updated SWPCP is required to be submitted by August 31, 2021.

Visual Monitoring Required?

Yes, required monthly

Any other Monitoring Applicable to all Sources (not sector specific monitoring):

Quarterly sampling for benchmark monitoring and impaired waters monitoring.

Minimum Inspection Frequency:

Monthly

Annual Report / Due Date:

No annual report

Training Frequency:

At least annually

Certification by Qualified Professional:

Certification only required for Tier II corrective actions and mass-reduction measures installed from previous permit cycles.
