



TEXAS STORMWATER PERMIT QUICK FAQs

Stormwater General Permit Issuance Date:
7/13/2016

Expiration Date:
8/14/2021

NOI Required to Continue Coverage:

Yes, NOI must be submitted within 90 days after issuance of the renewal

Fee Required / Fee Amount:

ePermitting: \$100
Paper Submittal: \$200

Any Expected Changes with Permit Renewal:

Yes, some general updates clarifying the permit requirements, specific updates to certain industrial sectors including SWP3 requirements and benchmark values and sampling. Outfall latitude and longitude must be shown on SWP3 diagram.

Anything Interesting or Different than EPA MSGP?

Rain gauge must be maintained onsite and rainfall must be recorded for each event and/or at least weekly until monitoring is completed for the monitoring period.

Texas uses the acronym "SWP3" instead of SWPPP.

Plan Required to Be Submitted to the Agency?

No, only upon request.

Visual Monitoring Required?

Yes, Quarterly.

Any other Monitoring Applicable to all Sources (not sector specific monitoring):

Additional water quality monitoring required if discharging to Impaired Water Bodies. Annual hazardous metals monitoring unless eligible for waiver.

Minimum Inspection Frequency:

Quarterly. Certain sectors are required to conduct monthly inspections.

Annual Report / Due Date:

March 31st, if subject to DMR or Benchmark Monitoring Requirements

Training Frequency:

Annual

Certification by Qualified Professional:

No
