Any Expected Changes with Permit Renewal:

Previously, In order to disperse permit renewals so that approximately the same number of industrial stormwater permits come up for renewal each year, the MSGP was divided into five Groups. This is being re-aligned to be consistent with the expiration

Anything Interesting or Different than EPA MSGP?

UDWQ recently decided that sources that maintain an individual permit and have both industrial point source discharges and stormwater discharges associated with industrial activity now have to obtain both an individual UPDES permit and seek coverage under the Utah MSGP separately. So going forward these facilities will maintain two permits.

No, only upon request

Yes Quarterly
